- 4. The poem suggests that being a "lighthouse" is a calling. How do you understand your own calling as a man? How does it connect with these virtues? This delves into deeper purpose and meaning.
- 5. What practical steps can you take this week to strengthen one of the "lighthouse" virtues in your life, or to be a more effective source of guidance and support for those around you? This focuses on concrete action and application of the discussion.
